



Aviation Hubs: Singapore, Bangkok, Kuala Lumpur, Jakarta, Manila, Ho Chi Minh City














Emirates: 35 in E.U., 11 in ASEAN

Qatar: 32 in E.U., 10 in ASEAN


Etihad: 16 in E.U., 6 in ASEAN

Intra-ASEAN – 3rd/4th/5th freedoms now fully open. *But slot restrictions in Jakarta and Manila*




What's NOT in ASEAN Single Market – 7th Freedom and Multiple Bases
